## FAQ'S

### What is the philosophy governing the Advanced Orthodontic Courses for the General Practitioner?

As an initiation into orthodontic principles and practice, lecture courses are certainly valuable, and are recommended. However when the General Practitioner embarks on actual treatment of a significant number of orthodontic cases, explanation and guidance at the "hands on" level is extremely helpful. However, orthodontic treatment is a long term commitment for both patient and clinician. Frequent visits and re-evaluation of progress are essential. For this reason the Advanced Orthodontic Courses operate on a continuous 12 month a year basis, whereas intermittent courses leave the practitioner uncertain as to how to proceed as cases advance toward completion.

### Who is eligible to join an Advanced Group?

General Dentists who have taken a Basic Course, or who are recent graduates of UBC, or who have had exposure since graduation to fixed appliance principles and practice. If in doubt, contact Dr. Lear, or the Director of Continuing Dental Education.

### Who provides the patients?

Patients must be "patients of record" in the participant's practice. UBC Continuing Education does not have a pool of persons awaiting treatment.

### What is the scope and format of the sessions held each month?

Approximately the first 2 ½ hours are spent in discussion of detailed records for patients for whom treatment is proposed. After the general outline is given, the entire group is encouraged to participate in the discussion. Dr. Lear chairs the meeting. The atmosphere is friendly, constructive and cordial! The second 2 ½ hours is spent in the UBC Sutherland clinic, where Dr. Lear works directly with each participant and his/her patients. Discussion and demonstration to all members are ongoing during the clinic time.

### What are the benefits to a practice of attending the Advanced Orthodontics courses?

The courses provide opportunity to further develop diagnostic and clinical skills to integrate another tier of services for the participant's patients. Esthetic benefits are stressed as well as the relationship of orthodontics to restorative, prosthodontic and periodontic needs.

### Is it necessary to bring any equipment, instruments, supplies or products to the advanced courses?

No, all instruments and equipment are made available without extra charge by Continuing Dental Education. Clinic sundries such as gloves, masks etc. are also supplied. Brackets, wires, bands etc. are available in the clinic. Each practitioner has an account set up at the beginning of the academic year, and is invoiced for the brackets etc. in August.

### Why do many participants come back year after year?

As noted already, the nature of orthodontics is a long term intensive commitment between patient and clinician. Therefore existing participants frequently renew their membership annually, as the ability to access guidance right through the summer assists progression towards the treatment goal.

## COURSE OUTLINE

This course provides detailed instruction in diagnosis, treatment planning and specifics of treatment procedures for general practitioners who already have some familiarity with orthodontic procedures. It is emphasized that these sessions provide practical experience, on an ongoing basis, with the practitioner's own patients. This course is not limited to theoretical concepts and laboratory procedures.

Case presentations and discussions on treatment planning will be held at each session and will supplement clinical treatment of patients. Participants are responsible for providing their own patients.

## CLINICIAN

**Clement Lear, BDS, DMD, DipOrtho, FCDSBC**, is a certified specialist in Orthodontics and has a private practice limited to orthodontics in Burnaby. Dr. Lear holds degrees from the University of New Zealand and Harvard University. He undertook graduate work, research, and teaching for nine years at Harvard. He was Head of the Department of Orthodontics at UBC for thirteen years and has lectured widely to undergraduate students and general and specialist practitioners in Canada and the United States.

It should be noted that regular attendance is required in order to maintain proper continuity of service to patients, and to keep abreast of the progress of the participants. Therefore, participants will need to be able to make a commitment to attend virtually all of the 12 sessions. For this reason part-time registration cannot be offered. Continuing education credits will be submitted to the College of Dental Surgeons of BC by Continuing Dental Education.
