Basic Principles of Endodontics from Access to Obturation: What's Changed?

Endodontic Treatment Options and Restorative Decisions

DR. JEFF COIL

This presentation will review the basis principles of, and provide clinical tips for, access cavity preparation, instrumentation, canal disinfection, obturation and access restoration.

Following eight different endodontic treatment options, the success and longevity of an endodontically treated tooth depends highly on the subsequent restorative management. This presentation will compare and contrast good and bad restorative decisions that have direct effects on Endodontic outcomes.

Management of Immature Teeth

Geriatric Endodontics and the Effect of Systemic Diseases on Endodontic Procedures and Outcomes

Apexification, apexogenesis and regenerative procedures are all used in the management of immature teeth. This presentation will outline the diagnosis, treatment steps, and outcome assessment for each of these procedures. A number of clinical cases will be presented.

Geriatric endodontics is more than just treatment of calcified canals. The geriatric patient and their associated medications can strongly influence clinical endodontic management. Come and see how systemic diseases affect Endodontic procedures and outcomes.

Assessing Outcomes and Management of Apical Periodontitis; Retreatment or Surgery versus Extraction and Implant

Endodontic Emergencies

Endodontic retreatment versus endodontic surgery should always be discussed as treatment options to patients with recurrent apical periodontitis. The informed patient can then better make a decision on how they would like to be managed.

Current techniques for endodontic retreatment and examples of endodontic surgery will be presented. Extraction and implant are good treatment options for teeth that have a hopeless prognosis, or for those patients who prefer to have their tooth removed and have an implant supported prosthesis. A number of cases will be presented showing these various treatment options.

Come and learn management strategies for endodontic emergencies for new patients, midtreatment flare-ups, and post-obturation cases.

Planning for Successful Dental & Implant Restorations

DR. CHRIS WYATT

Dr. Chris Wyatt will share his expertise and quarter century of clinical experience as a prosthodontist and general dentist with regard to successful diagnoses and treatment planning for dental restorations. Complex multidisciplinary cases will be discussed as well as seemingly simple cases to identify how, when, and with whom to treat these patients. Detailed topics will include aesthetics, occlusion, structural integrity, and bone support for teeth and implants. The seminars will be augmented with individual patient case presentations to illustrate the keys to planning, dealing with complications, and providing successful dental reconstructions and rehabilitations. Evidence based material from the dental literature will be used to discuss success rates of various restorations, materials, and patients. Success will be explored in relation to complications, and outright failure. The goal throughout the seminars is to provide general dentists with the knowledge and clinical tips to plan for successful dental and implant restorations.

- Treatment Planning for Crowns & Bridges on Natural Teeth
- Treatment Planning for Crowns & Bridges on Implants
- Success, Failure & Complications of Dental & Implant Restorations
- Endodontically treated teeth and the need for Posts & Cores

A portion of this presentation will be given jointly with Dr. Coil.





JEFFREY M. COIL, DMD, MSD, PhD, FRCD(C), FADI, received his undergraduate, dental and doctorate degrees from the University of British Columbia. He practiced general dentistry for eight years and was a Clinical Instructor in Endodontics and Periodontics, before

obtaining his certificate in Endodontics at the University of Washington in 1993. Dr. Coil is a Diplomate, American Board of Endodontics. He serves as an editorial consultant for the Journal of the Canadian Dental Association and on the Scientific Advisory Board for the Journal of Endodontics. He is a past President of the Canadian Academy of Endodontics, and is a member of the British Columbia Society of Endodontists and the American Association of Endodontists. Dr. Coil is the mentor of the Northwest Endodontic Study Club and Seminar, and is currently the Director of the Graduate Endodontics Program, Department of Oral Biological and Medical Sciences, University of British Columbia, Canada.



CHRIS WYATT, BSc, DMD, MSc, FRCD(C), Dip Pros, is a Certified Specialist in Prosthodontics and a Professor and Head of the Division of Prosthodontics and Dental Geriatrics at the University of British Columbia, Faculty of Dentistry. He has published numerous papers in the

field of prosthodontics, implant dentistry, dental caries, and geriatrics. In 1998, Dr. Wyatt was the recipient of the Killam Teaching Award and is the 2009 recipient of the W.W. Wood Award for "Excellence in Dental Education." Dr. Wyatt is past President of the Association of Prosthodontists of Canada and the BC Society of Prosthodontists, and a member of the Pacific Coast Society for Prosthodontics. He is an active member of the Canadian Dental Association, British Columbia Dental Association, and the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia. In addition to lecturing and providing continuing education courses on Prosthodontics within and outside of Canada, he enjoys treating patients with prosthodontic concerns in his private practice.
